



Reducing Emissions

Emirates supports IATA's collective industry commitment to reach net zero carbon emissions by 2050 and prioritises decarbonisation through:

- Operating modern and fuel-efficient aircraft: Our new Airbus A350 and Boeing 777X aircraft on order will be UD to 22% more fuel efficient than the previous generation of aircraft.
- Following Green Operating Procedures (Green OPs), integral to our Flight Operations fuel efficiency programme.
- Investing in solar power systems to generate clean electricity at major facilities in the UAE.
- Contributing to the deployment and scaling up of sustainable aviation fuel (SAF), which can reduce lifecycle emissions by up to 80% compared with conventional jet fuel.



Consuming Responsibly

Emirates is dedicated to responsible consumption, encompassing the lifecycle of purchasing, sourcing, consuming, and managing the disposal of products and equipment:

- We implemented and enhanced our Supplier Code of Conduct in 2022 and we conduct due diligence on our key suppliers to ensure ethical and sustainable practices.
- We made a public commitment to reducing single-use plastic on board in 2019 and have an active programme to reduce cabin and catering waste, with the support of our cabin crew and Emirates Flight Catering.
- Our Business Class customers can pre-order their main meal and help reduce food wastage.
- We have a range of amenity items, including children's bags, made from alternative materials such as washable kraft paper, recycled plastic bottles and organically sourced botanic fibres.
- In 2023, we launched a closed loop recycling initiative, through which unserviceable meal tray items are repurposed into fresh, ready-to-use Emirates meal service products.
- We launched a unique capsule collection of luggage, bags and accessories fashioned from upcycled materials from retrofitted aircraft in 2023, all designed and handmade by Emirates Engineering tailors.

Preserving Wildlife & Habitats

- We manage the Dubai Desert Conservation Reserve (DDCR), a 225km² protected area for some of the UAE's distinctive and endangered fauna and flora.
- We have a zero-tolerance policy on carrying banned species, hunting trophies, donkey skins, or any products associated with illegal wildlife activities.
- We are a founding signatory of the Buckingham Palace Declaration and a member of United for Wildlife (UfW) since March 2016.
- We actively contribute towards the UfW Transport Taskforce and are part of the Steering Committee of the UfW MENA Chapter.
- We introduced comprehensive wildlife awareness training, equipping over 30,000 employees with the skills to identify and report signs of wildlife trafficking in both passenger and cargo operations.
